



Teruyuki Fujita

Dr. Teruyuki Fujita is a Professor at the Institute of Education, Faculty of Human Sciences, University of Tsukuba. He teaches career guidance and counseling at the School of Education, and comparative policy studies on career education promotion measures at the Graduate School of Comprehensive Human Sciences.

After completing the doctoral program at University of Tsukuba, he started his professional career in 1993 as an assistant professor for teacher training courses at a private university. In 1998, he returned to University of Tsukuba as a faculty member and continued working at the university for 10 years. Then in 2008, he was appointed as a principal researcher at the Guidance and Counseling Research Center, National Institute for Educational Policy Research of Japan (NIER). He concurrently served as the senior specialist for student guidance, at Student Affairs Division, Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT).

During the 5 years at NIER, Teruyuki and his colleagues conducted various researches on career education such as policy analysis and nationwide factual investigations. Simultaneously at MEXT, he led the team responsible for national career education promotion policies, and published a series of teachers' manuals on career education.

He received an excellence award for his academic works from the Japanese Society for the Study of Career Education in 2010, and also one from the Japan Association for Career Development Guidance in 2007.
